

The assumption is that if all were asking this question seriously and acting upon it then all would be moving in ways that would both deepen our authentic respective identities and draw us into a more intimate relationship." (Durham Centre for Catholic Studies).

# Monthly Tip for Sustainable Living

Only 32% of plastic waste across the UK is recycled each year. Up to 4 million tons goes to landfill, is lost in the environment, or enters our rivers and seas. We can make a difference if we all limit our use of plastic. Some small ways are:

- Buying fruit and vegetables loose if possible
- Using refillable bottles for washing up liquid, shampoo, hand-wash, household cleaners
- Preferring reusable containers or food wraps to clingfilm
- Carrying a reusable cup for takeaway drinks
- Rejecting plastic bottles of water a plastic bottle will only start to decompose after about 450 years
