Members of the SVP would like to thank all who were involved in the recent Christmas Party for the elderly and housebound – especially those who donated raffle prizes, gave donations and helped with the clearing and washing up. It was a very enjoyable afternoon.

Note from the Buildings Committee

As a part of the refurbishment of St. Godric's after the fire in 1987, 48 high level 500-watt halogen lights were installed. The uplighters provided an even, reflected light throughout the church. After a few years the wattage was reduced to 200 watts, with little perceived change in the lighting level. This was at a time when the church was used daily, and it generated a considerable saving in energy costs. Halogen lamps have now been withdrawn from sale and this was the catalyst for a review of the lighting to take place.

The new fittings use 50-watt LED lamps. As well as being cheaper to run, the longevity of the lamp is greatly increased, and carbon emissions are much reduced. We did look at providing dimmer switches on the system but the original cabling and switching grid made it difficult to achieve.
