
1. Introduction

2. Parish overview

Our worshipping community was established with the construction of the church of Our Lady of Mercy and St. Godric in 1864, in order to help the Church supply extra capacity to St. Cuthbert's Church for the growing Catholic population of the city. As the City continued to grow, the Church of St. Bede's was constructed to serve Framwellgate Moor and Newton Hall, and a separate parish was formed when St. Joseph's Church was built to serve the growing population at Gilesgate.

In 2013, due to the reduced number of clergy in our diocese and in order to function more effectively in our ministry, it was decided to merge the Parish of Our Lady of Mercy, St. Godric and St. Bede with the Parish of St. Joseph, under the continued guidance of the Very Rev. Fr. Colm Hayden, who had previously been the parish priest of both parishes. We decided that our new parish would be named in honour of the many Catholics martyred for their faith in Durham during the Protestant Reformation. Since then, we have continued to flourish as one community living out the Gospel not only in our three churches but as one Church across the city joined with our brethren throughout the world in The Holy Catholic Church.

We come together as one community to celebrate the great feasts of Christmas and Easter in St. Leonard's School, helping us to truly unite to celebrate these great feasts of the liturgical year

We are very fortunate to have our own Durham Martyr's Mass setting, composed by Roger McKone, a parishioner and one of our music leads. The Mass setting was first performed in our parish in 2018 when we celebrated our fifth anniversary.

	Durham City Circle was formed around 1930 by a past parishioner of Durham Martyrs Parish. Part of the ethos of the Association is to strengthen family life through friendship and faith. Like many of the Associations within the Catholic Church and wider society numbers are dwindling, attitudes are changing, and the profile of the Catholic church appears to be aging with less young people involved. However, Durham City Circle retains a membership of 23 of which 8 are within the Parish of the Durham Martyrs. Past members from our Parish include Joe Joyce (Head teacher St Godric's), Joe Hadfield, Colin Ingleby, Kevin Crilley, J.J. Smith and Eric Smith, this is not a complete list.
	The Catenians support students involved in projects, gap years and other voluntary work, examples include projects such as the Columbian Project, the Peru Mission, HCPT and the Lourdes Diocesan Pilgrimage. Each year the President of Durham City Circle identifies a charity of his choice all the money raised goes direct to the charity. In the past Durham has supported Siobhan McGee in her Columbian project, Joe Plumb in the Peru Mission, Baby feeding stations in India and this year the ACROSS Trust, to name a few. A number of students attending St Leonard's have received bursary awards to help them in their voluntary work.
